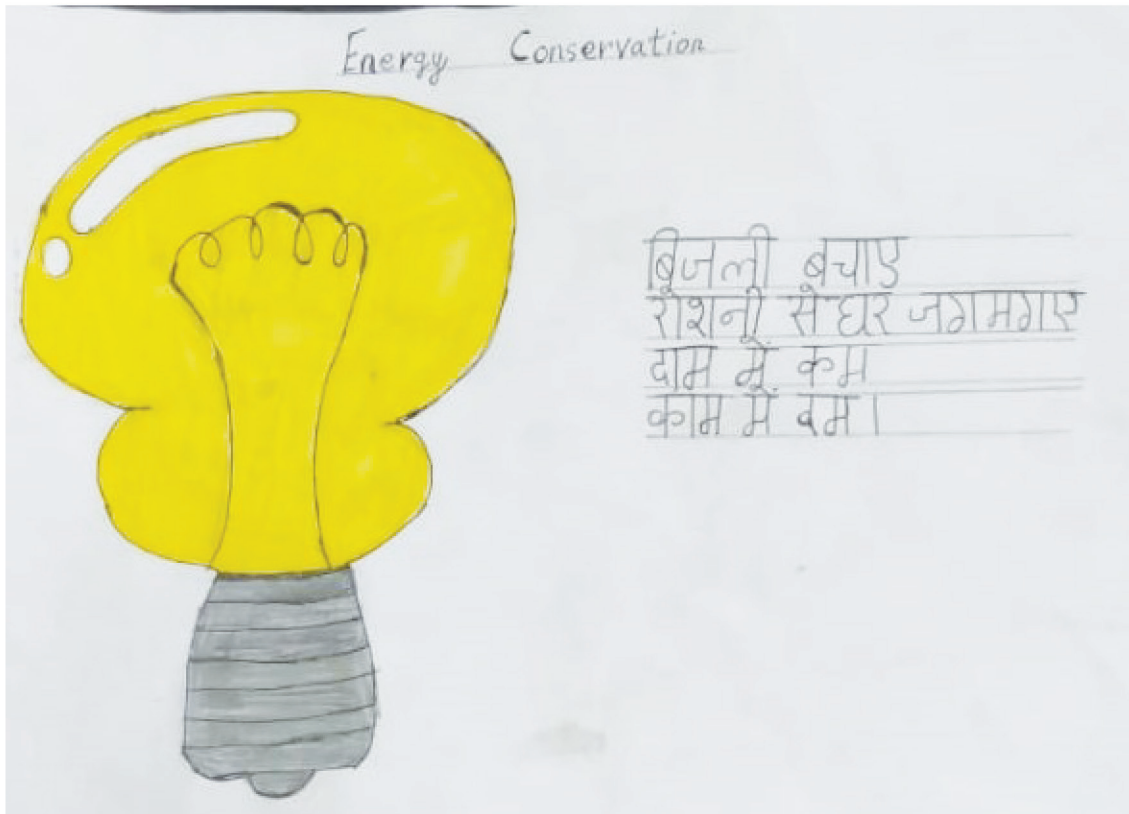

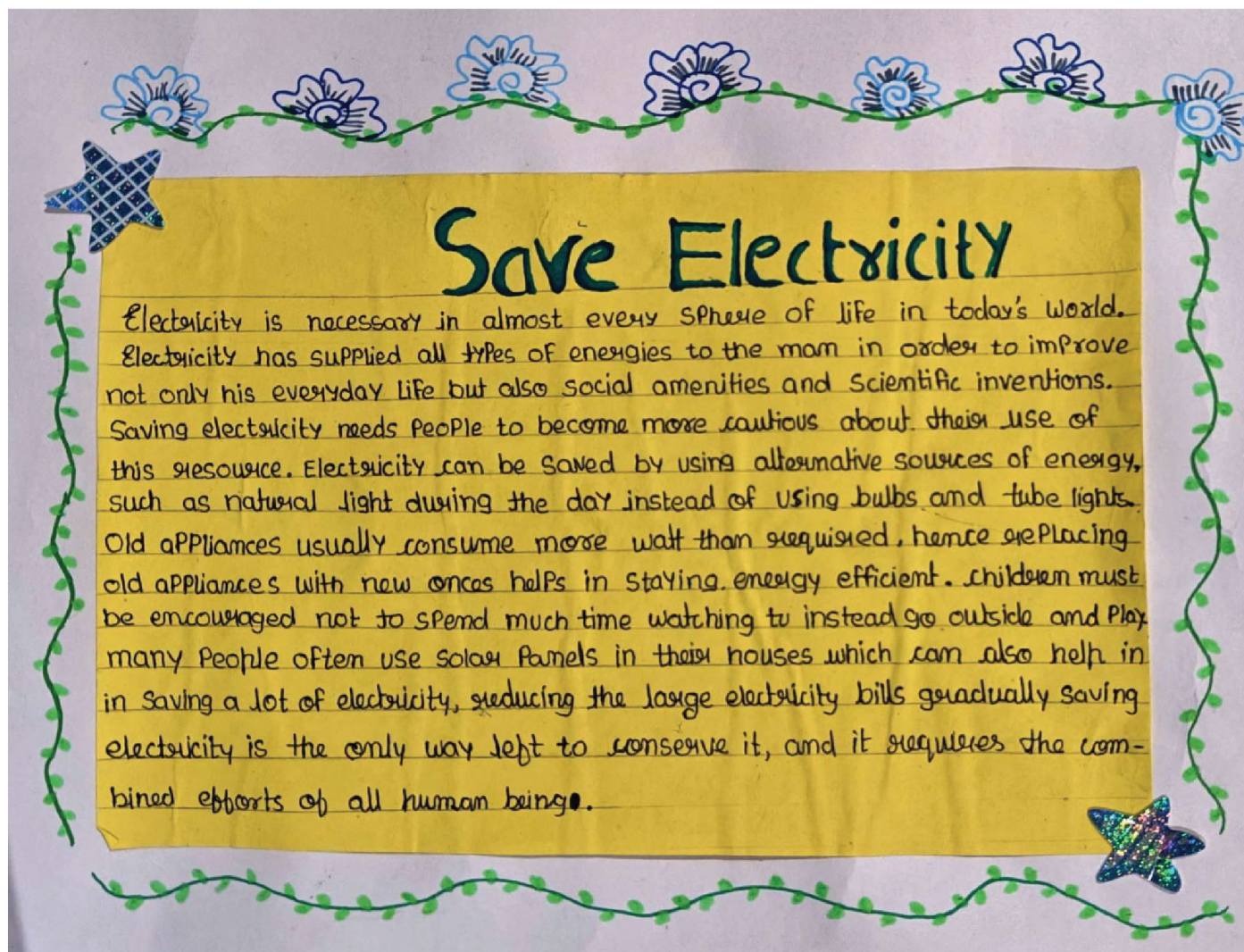
Poster and Slogan on 'Energy Conservation' by a student of Rachana School



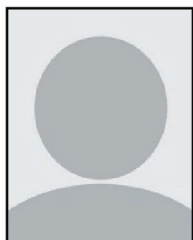

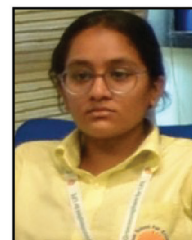

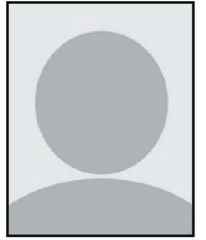

→ A day without electricity

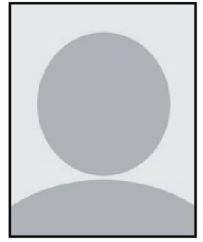
